


I. Outcomes of Numismatics

Why studying the coins?



- Combine textual via the legend
 - iconography via the representation in the field
- Political instrument in the hands of persons and institutions (city, etc.) representing the power, the authority:
 - Offering a way to represent, communicate, political, economic, and financial decisions from their perspective
 - Vector of ideology
- Daily life perspective: ritual deposit, foundation deposits, losses, ... via hoards and single finds resulting from settlements and religious sites:
 - Use of the coins
 - Refer to different levels of the society





For example, the Roman monetary system dated from Augustus reform was divided into three main classes but is a quadrimetallic system; gold (aureus), silver (denarius) and brass (sestercius, dupondius) and copper (as, semis, quadrans).





Contexts refer to different phases of the life of the coin:

- > Primary context | minting of the coin
- > Secondary context its use
- > Tertiary context | deposition or loss
- (depend on multifactorial parameters: available liquidity, degree of circulation = velocity of the coin, ...)
- ➤ Quaternary context by F. Kemmers → retrieval of the coin and investigation

Interpretations resulting from the identification


- The use of the coins: monetary patterns of high value coins, daily life coins and their context of discoveries ...;
- Functions of the depositions: accidental losses, emergency hoards, saving hoards or abandoned hoards (Grierson 1975: 130–6), ritual hoards and offerings in sanctuaries;
- The movement of the coins from minted place to its deposition location: may reflect event, the movement of the Roman emperor, ...;
- Functions of coins: money, mounted in jewellery with social, religious dimension (ritual, apotropaic dimension (protection), funerary).




Hoard: deposit containing at least several coins intentionally concealed together, and for a reason which escapes us, has not been recovered.








Roman Provincial Coinage online

The **Roman Provincial Coinage** project embodies a new conception of Roman coinage. It presents for the first time an authoritative account of the coins minted in the provinces of the empire and shows how they can be regarded as an integral part of the coinage minted under the Roman emperors.

The aim of this major research project is to produce a standard typology of the provincial coinage of the Roman Empire. This represents the first systematic treatment of the civic coinage at the height of the Roman empire. The material presented is an invaluable source of information for imperial portraiture and titulature, the response of the cities to the establishment of a new political order under the Roman empire, the way the government controlled the provinces, the internal history of the cities, and the role of the provincial coinage in the economy of the Roman empire as a whole. It will thus not only meet the needs of numismatists but will also be an essential reference book for historians, epigraphists, archaeologists and other students of the Roman empire.

The publication of *Roman Provincial Coinage volume I (44 BC–AD 69)* in 1992 marked the start of this international initiative, which **will comprise ten volumes** in all. *Roman Provincial Coinage* is published by British Museum Press and the Bibliothèque Nationale de France, and the online publication is based in the Ashmolean Museum, University of Oxford.








Data type:

- Hoard: any group of coin finds which has been classified as a hoard.
- Hoard?: any group of coin finds which may be a hoard, but where some doubt has been raised e.g. A grave group or a dispersed hoard mixed with site finds.
- Group of single finds: coins found in close proximity to each other which, on the basis of circumstances of discovery or of archaeological context, are likely to have been deposited or lost at the same time but which do not constitute a hoard under the generally accepted meaning. Use of this category should be kept to a minimum.
- Single gold coin: this is self-explanatory. Where possible, the project is collecting data on single gold coins as they may represent stores of value in the same way as hoards.'



- Question the limits of the dataset:
 - Does the dataset reflect the overall monetary circulation, quantity of the data,...
- Its representativity:
 - Does all the data reflets the circulation? For Georgia, the dataset from CHRE up to date refers a lot to excavations from the cemeteries, mentioned in Soviet catalogues and Moneta catalogues.
 - Cf. Lara Fabian personal dataset more important and give another insight
- Project in progress: a more comprehensive dataset is required
